How has your school's spending improved PE attainment?	There is a lot of confidence in providing active opportunities in relation to sport. The scheme of work is fully progressive and supports learning which builds up over time. Children are developing a wider awareness of different ways to remain active including competition but also active sports that they play for enjoyment. PE coaches are used well to support staff in developing their confidence to make required adaptations to make lessons

inclusive for all.
All children participate in active sessions and competitions. There is a range of opportunities that include selective events but also whole class events. Providing role models for the children has encouraged them to see different ways to stay active.
Being mindful of different children's needs has encouraged us to look wider than the normal offer. Activities such as Boccia, Curling and Archery have been received well. Children choose to come in at breaktime to join in with active hall sessions.
A wider offer has made been made available. Some clubs have been targeted at particular groups to aid participation e.g. girls football. Links with local schools have brought in new opportunities for youth coaching.
Some CPD has been delivered to all staff. Teachers have been asked to turn their sequence of lessons into a clear 6 week plan - identifying clear knowledge - and seeking support from the PE coaches to ensure inclusivity for all. Attending events and watching 'experts' has also been beneficial to staff development.
Our SLA with the TrustEd includes a wide range of sporting competitions and events. These are led by experienced sport leaders which has helped teachers and teaching assistants to observe how different areas of PE are taught effectively.
No more than 18 children are in the pool at any time. We pay for 2 swimming teachers and they support school staff in teaching an additional group. We also pay for an additional TA who goes in the water if and when required.
All swimming staff have been tasked with teaching water safety. They have looked at safe rescue from the water's edge and looked at strategies for children to keep themselves safe if they are in difficulty: treading water and floating.

Teachers are more confident in delivering effective PE lessons in conjunction with the scaffold provided by Get Get for PE and CPD. TAs and teachers have a broader understanding of different ways to engage and encourage active participation. Community links continue to strengthen and more families are aware of local opportunites.
